



The AIOthman Scholarship

The AIOthman Scholarship of £17,230 per annum is available to one International first year student accepted on the BA Fashion course at Central Saint Martins, University of the Arts London.

The scholarship will be assessed on academic merit and, will provide a contribution towards the course tuition fees for each year of the course.

Applications are welcome from those who can demonstrate exceptional academic excellence.

To be eligible for the AIOthman Scholarship students must be:

- Considered and International student for tuition fee purposes
- AND**
- Ordinarily resident in Bahrain, Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria and, United Arab Emirates.
- AND**
- Accepted on the first year of study on the full-time BA Fashion course at Central Saint Martins, University of the Arts London, commencing September 2018. Course entry requirements and application guidelines can be found on the course page – [here](#)

The Assessment Procedure for Applications

An assessment panel will shortlist based on academic merit and creative excellence. Applications shortlisted as a result of the above process will then be forwarded onto a selection panel.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited for interview at Central Saint Martins. Applicants will be required to bring their portfolio and examples of their work to the interview.

Students shortlisted for interviews will be contacted by the Student Funding Service shortly after the application deadline. If you have not been offered an interview, please assume that your application has not been successful.

The panel will make their final selections by marking the quality of application and the preparedness for high quality study in the discipline area, and the articulation of how the AIOthman Scholarship will contribute to the applicant's studies.

The selection panel's decision is final and no correspondence whatsoever will be accepted or considered once the decision has been made.

Terms of the AIOthman Scholarship

The scholarship will provide a contribution of £17,230 towards course fees for each year of the course except the placement year.

Tuition fees will be paid directly from the award to the University's Tuition Fees account.

Applicants must enrol on the course in the same academic year for which they have applied for

funding. Failure to do so will result in your application being rejected or the award withdrawn.

Award recipients cannot be in receipt of more than one UAL affiliated or administered award. Applicants can apply for more than one award but if offered more than one UAL affiliated or administered award, the award recipient will need to choose which award to receive.

The AIOthman Scholarship recipient is expected to attend all timetabled classes and tutorials, excepting periods of absence due to illness. Attendance will be monitored, and any student with an unacceptable attendance record may risk the termination of their award.

Award recipients are expected to attend a small number of College and University events promoting scholarship support to potential donors, and to meet with scholarship supporters at these events, during and wherever convenient after completing their course.

The award will be terminated if registration/enrollment lapses on any grounds, other than temporary suspension of study due to extenuating circumstances, which must be drawn to the attention of the relevant Course Director at the College through formal procedures and upheld by the College's Extenuating Circumstances Panel.

This award is purely discretionary, and therefore no applicant for the award should make any decisions with respect to their enrolment, financial arrangements etc. relying on the outcome of their application for such an award until the winner is formally notified.

Applying for the AIOthman Scholarship



Applications must be made online. You will need to fill in an [online application](#).

In addition to the online application form, you will need to send the following supplementary material:

1. An electronic portfolio sent via dropbox to scholarshipapplications@arts.ac.uk containing **1 PDF document**, which should be an example of what you consider to be your best work for the Selection Panel to review, and must include:
 - title page with your name and course title
 - introductory page of no more than 500 words explaining your work
 - up to 15 pages of images with **each image** numbered and clearly labelled showing the date of production and, if relevant, title, size and materials used in the original piece.
2. A copy of your most up to date Curriculum Vitae (CV)
3. A copy of your passport photo page
4. An academic or professional reference
5. Household income evidence (please see online application form for more information)
6. Evidence of medical condition (where appropriate)
7. Evidence of financial hardship* (if applicable)
8. Evidence of residency

* **Financial hardship** refers to unexpected events or unforeseen changes that impacts cash flow, for example: changes in income or expenditure, changes in employment status (such as losing a job or having hours reduced) are unexpected or unforeseen circumstances that have financial repercussions or impact heavily on your finances. This does not include last month's rent or bills.

Instructions for Uploading your Portfolio via Dropbox

- Go to www.dropbox.com and create an account.
- Login to your account using your user name and password.
- Create a new folder by selecting this icon  in the top right hand corner just before the search box. **Be sure to use your full name as the name of the folder.**
- Open the folder and upload your portfolio into this folder by clicking on this icon  in the top right hand corner just before the search box. This takes you to your desktop to select your file(s).
- Once your file(s) are uploaded in the folder, right click on the folder and select the option share link.
- In the dialogue box, enter the address scholarshipapplications@arts.ac.uk
- Please **include your name and the scholarship you are applying for in the message box before sending.**

All applications must be received by **1pm, Friday 15 June 2018**. There is only one closing date for applications each year.

We are unable to accept applications that arrive late. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
