UAL does not send any waste to landfill. Material we cannot reuse internally goes to two streams.

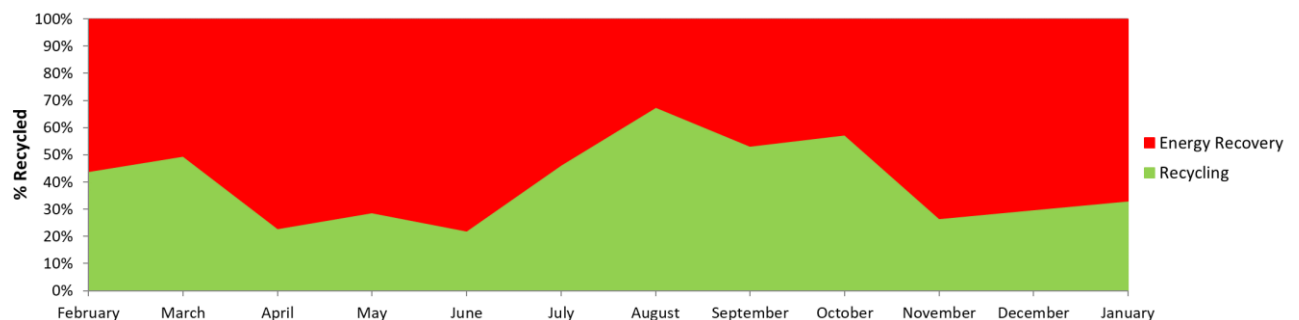
Waste to Energy – this is all the waste which cannot be recycled and instead is burned for energy. We should aim to keep this figure as low as possible.

Mixed Recycling – this is all refuse that is fit for recycling. We should seek to keep this figure higher than the waste to energy.

We can then monitor each site's progress towards our recycling goals.

For the academic buildings no waste was collected during spring 2020 lockdown due to building closure and almost no waste was collected in June and July and the amount has slowly increased as buildings become busier.

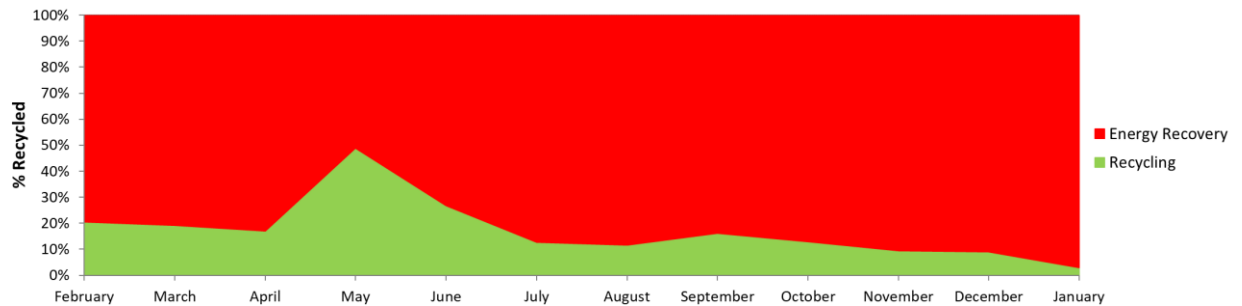
UAL manages the utilities for only the three halls below.

Brooke Hall



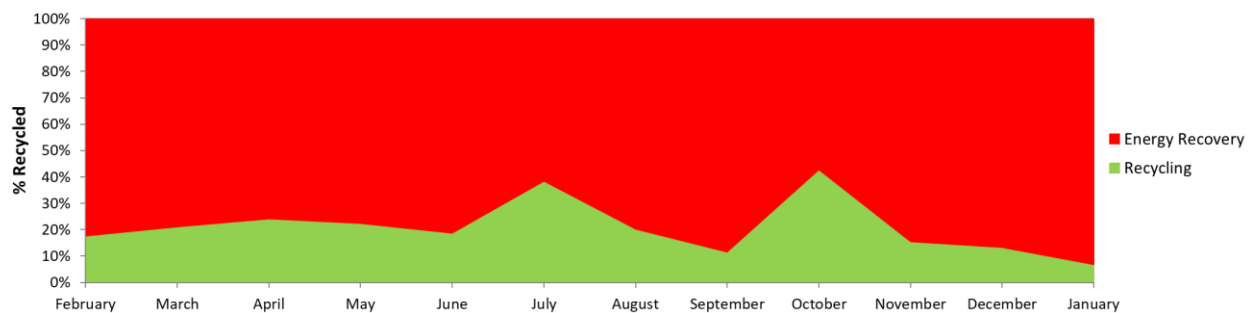
